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# **Inquisitive**

This year the school focus is **Inquisitive**.


Year 1 is the **<u>Frida Kahlo</u>** class. Frida Kahlo was a significant individual from the past who was curious to explore different ideas and cultures. Her inquisitive nature helped her to create unique paintings that make people think about the world in new ways.

We will keep aiming to **STRIVE** to be like Frida Kahlo in everything that we do.


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During Block 3 our theme is **What makes a superhero?** This will be explored in relation to the themes of **responsibility** and **trust**.

We will be looking at significant individuals in the past and present who have contributed to national achievements; significant historical events, people and places in our own locality including looking at Florence Nightingale and Stepping Hill Hospital. We will read *Traction Man is Here* and write our own version of the story. In Science we will learn about the human body and healthy foods. We will discuss what makes a healthy sandwich and design and make them as part of our Design and Technology sessions.









In Maths we will continue with addition and subtraction within 20 and move on to looking at numbers up to 50. We will also look at measuring length, height, mass and volume.

We will continue to use the **Essential Letters and Sounds** scheme to teach phonics. There is a daily phonics lesson where the teacher teaches a new sound, or reviews sounds learned earlier in the week

Phonics

During the summer term your child will take the **Phonic Screening Check**. The Phonics Check occurs annually in June for all Year 1 children. Children read 40 real and pseudo (made up) words to test their phonics decoding ability. The pass mark is usually 32. Your child's score will be reported on your their end of year report.

The children have **3** different homework activities each week:

#### 1) Maths –Workbook

- \* Children will use a work book to complete the work.
- \* A page in the booklet will be set a **Friday** and will be due the following **Thursday**.

### 2) Reading - online

- \* Children will use Reading Eggs.
- \* A comprehension lesson will be set on a **Friday** and will be due the following **Friday**.

## 3) Spelling – spelling homework books



\* Children will receive a set of spellings to practise each week.

\* Children need to pick **1 activity** from the spelling activities list inside the front cover of their spelling homework book and complete it.

\* Spellings are given out on a **Friday** and children will be tested on these words the following **Friday**.



Please read for a minimum of 10 minutes every night.

Children will have 2 books:

- **Decodable reader** These books are to practise specific phonic sounds and may stay with your child for several weeks.
- <u>Shared reader</u> These books are for you to share with your child to encourage a love of reading and include fiction, non-fiction and poetry. These reading books will be collected in and changed **twice a week**.

Please ensure your child's reading packet (with their decodable reader, shared reader and reading record) is in school **every day** and that your child's reading record is filled in every time they read and signed once they have finished their book in order that it can be changed.

The children will move up colour bands for their Shared Reader as their reading progresses. They will move up to the next colour band when they **can fluently and audibly read the words** as well **as understand the content of what they** 

have read. They need to be able to confidently answer a range of questions such as: recalling the events of the story, predicting what might happen next and why, deducing the meaning of words from the context clues on the page, inferring why a character did or said something and we focus on other areas too.

The children's books will be changed on **<u>Tuesday</u>** and <u>Friday</u>.

We will be doing PE every <u>Monday</u> and <u>Thursday</u>. The children will need to make sure they come into school in their PE kits on these days.
