Early Years education focuses on seven areas of learning




CL Communication and Language PD Physical Development

Children's reading books will be changed on a **Monday** and **Thursday**. Please make sure you have signed the reading record or books will not be changed.

The children will move up colour bands. They will move up to the next colour band when they can fluently and audibly read the words as well as understand the content of what they have read







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Religious Education:

God's World

Children will begin to hear about God's wonderful world. They will know that God loves each one of us. The children will learn about plants, fruits and animals in God's world. They will know that God made us and that we are unique. They will begin to understand that God loves each one of us always.

What you can do to help:

- When walking with your child talk about God's creations
- Thank God for his beautiful world, in your prayers

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Children will be encouraged to describe self in positive terms and talk about abilities. They will explain their own knowledge and understanding and asks appropriate questions of others. Children will begin to accept the needs of others and can take turns and share resources, sometimes with support from others.

What you can do to help:

- Encourage your child to put their own shoes and coat on
- Ask your child to help with simple jobs at home
- Encourage your child to get dressed and undressed independently.

Communication and Language

Children will be given lots of opportunities to maintain attention, concentrate and sits quietly during appropriate activities. They will begin to follow a story without pictures or props. They will begin to question why things happen and give explanations. Asks e.g. who, what, when, how.

What you can do to help:

- Read stories to your child and ask them questions.
- Talk to them about what they have done at school.
- Use the class dojo pictures as a starting point.
- Encourage them to question why things happen.

Physical Development

Children will begin to form recognisable letters holding a pencil between thumb and two fingers, no longer using whole-hand grasp. Shows some understanding that good practices with regard to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene can contribute to good health. Children will continue to develop gross motor skills in PE sessions these will include dance.

What you can do to help:

- Encourage your child to draw pictures.
- Encourage your child to write their own name.
- To practise climbing, jumping and running.
