RESILENT

This year the school focus will be **RESILENT**.

Year 1 will be the Florence Nightingale class. Florence Nightingale was a significant individual from the past who contributed to national and international achievements she showed resilience when she did this.

This year, we will **STRIVE** to be like Florence Nightingale in everything that we do.



Our theme this block is **Transport** and we will be reading The Train Ride, along with other stories including The Three Little Pigs. Your child will write labels and captions for pictures and recount a story. We will learn about Transport in History and create a time line. In Science we will learn about materials

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linked to the book The Three Little Pigs. In Maths we will focus on place value within 10 and then look at how we can add and subtract within 10. Please look at the curriculum overview for more details on the year ahead.



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We use a scheme called **Essential Letters and Sounds** to teach phonics. There is a daily phonics lesson where the teacher teaches a new sound, or reviews sounds learned earlier in the week

During the summer term your child will take the **Phonic Screening Check**. The Phonics Check occurs annually in June for all Year 1 children. Children read 40 real and pseudo (made up) words to test their phonics decoding ability. The pass mark is usually 32. Your child's score will be reported to you on their end of year report.

Religious Education

God's Great Plan - Until October half term



The children will learn about the beauty of God's world and explore and respond to the wonders of creation e.g. the

seasons. They will also hear about the story of Creation from Genesis and talk about its meaning. They will be reflecting on the knowledge that God made us because he loves us and develop their understanding that we show God we love him by looking after the world and each other. They will learn that we can spoil God's creation and that we have a responsibility to look after it, as well as hearing an appropriate part of the story of Noah and the Flood and its message of salvation and hope.

Mary, the Mother of God - until Christmas



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 \checkmark \checkmark The children will learn that God sent the Angel Gabriel with a message to Mary and will learn why this is important. They will learn that God asked Mary to be the mother of his son and will have an opportunity to reflect on her response.

They will hear about Mary's visit to her cousin, Elizabeth and reflect on the good news. They will begin to reflect on how we can prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus and learn that Mary is our mother in heaven and that she is looking after us.



In Year 1, the children have **3** different homework activities each week:

1) Maths – Workbook

- * Children will use a work book to complete the work.
- * A page in the booklet will be set a **Friday** and will be due the following **Thursday**.

2) Reading – online

- * Children will use Reading Eggs.
- * A comprehension lesson will be set on a Friday and will be due the following Monday.







* Children need to pick **1 activity** from the spelling activities list inside the front cover of their spelling homework book and complete it.

* Spellings are given out on a **Friday** and children will be tested on these words the following **Friday**.



Please read for a **minimum of 10 minutes** every night.

Children will have 2 books:

- **Decodable reader** These books are to practise specific phonic sounds and may stay with your child for several weeks.
- <u>Shared reader</u> These books are for you to share with your child to encourage a love of reading and include fiction, non-fiction and poetry. These reading books will be collected in and changed **twice a week**.

Please ensure your child's reading packet (with their decodable reader, shared reader and reading record) is in school **every day** and that your child's reading record is filled in every time they read and signed once they have finished their book in order that it can be changed.

The children will move up colour bands for their Shared Reader as their reading progresses. They will move up to the next colour band when they **can fluently and audibly read the words** as well **as understand the content of what they have read**.

They need to be able to confidently answer a range of questions such as: recalling the events of the story, predicting what might happen next and why, deducing the meaning of words from the context clues on the page, inferring why a character did or said something and we focus on other areas too.
