What did we learn in Block 3?

Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed our topics in Block 3 and have been very enthusiastic learners! This block we investigated the question, 'How is your life better because of the Ancient Egyptians?' We particularly enjoyed learning about the Ancient Egyptian beliefs on the afterlife and learnt about their process of mummification by mummifying tomatoes!

In RE and Faith Explorers lessons, we have deepened our understanding of our faith. We understand the importance of saying sorry for our sins and trying our best to show God that we will do better each time. We also have a greater understanding of the Mass and some of us have received the sacrament of First Forgiveness.

We have furthered our understanding of fractions, length and perimeter and have begun using formal methods to solve multiplication sums.

We read 'Flat Stanley: The Great Egyptian Grave Robbery', where we created our own flat characters and wrote a character description about them. We have also become great researchers, using books, videos and the internet to research Ancient Egyptians for a non-chronological report.

We have thoroughly enjoyed science in Block 3, where we had chance to experiment and investigate with magnets. We particularly enjoyed testing which magnet was the strongest!

What we will be learning in Block 4

In this block of learning, we will be investigating the question:

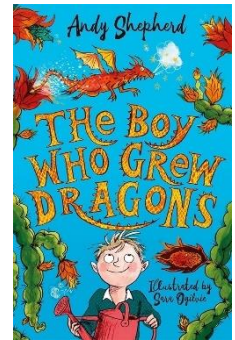
What is the land like in the United Kingdom and how do we use it?

We will use the themes of **change and community** to help us investigate this theme further.



In R.E. this block, we will continue our learning on **Celebrating Easter and Pentecost** until half term. Following this, our topic will focus on **Being a Christian**, where we will learn from the lives of some saints and how they dedicated their lives to being a good Christian. Our Faith Explorer lessons will focus on preparing the children for the sacrament of First Holy Communion.

Our main focus book this block will be 'The Boy Who Grew Dragons' by Andy Shepherd. In our writing lessons, we will create a flowchart to explain a process, explore performance poetry and finally, we'll write a short story involving a dragon!

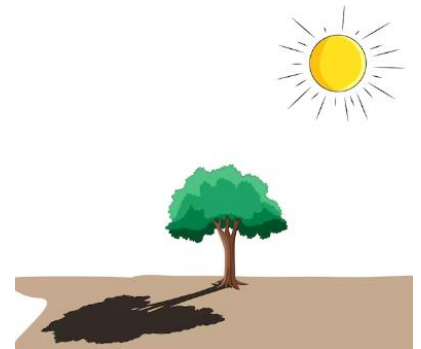


In Maths we will continue our learning from Year 2 on **Time**, progressing to telling the time by the minute and using digital clocks. We will also measure **Mass and Capacity** and deepen our knowledge of the **Properties of Shape**.



Please encourage your child to continue practising the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables at home.

In Science we will be looking at **Light** and **Plants**. We will learn about different sources of light, that darkness is the absence of light and how shadows are formed. We will also investigate how plants transport their water and learn about the part flowers play in the life cycle of plants, including pollination, seed dispersal and seed formation.



P.E. will take place every **Monday** and **Tuesday**.

On PE days, the children should come to school wearing their appropriate P.E. kits:

- Navy blue shorts or joggers
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Red school jumper



Monday's PE lessons will be swimming lessons. The children should wear their swimming costume/trunks under their PE kit and bring a towel with them (as well as underwear to change into after their swimming lesson). Our outdoor lessons will be Tennis up to half term and then Athletics for the final half term.

Homework:

1. Reading books

In Year 3, children should read for 20 minutes every evening and this should be recorded in their reading records. The reading records will be collected on a **Tuesday** and **Friday**, in order for the Year 3 team to monitor the children's reading.

Please ensure your child's reading book and record is in school every day.

2. Spelling

Children will be given some spelling words to learn on a **Monday** and will be tested on these words the following **Monday**.

Children will be provided with a spellings homework book and they should pick two activities from the spelling activities list to complete each week.

3. Maths

This year the children will receive a weekly written maths task inside their White Rose Homework books. This task will coincide with learning taking place in the classroom for that week, enabling children to consolidate their understanding of different mathematical strands. The children continue to have access to TTRockstars which they can log into and use to aid their knowledge of times tables. Purple Mash also has lots of Maths games which the children can access from home.

Homework will be set on a **Wednesday** and is due in for the following **Tuesday**.

4. Reading (online)

Online reading homework will be set every **Wednesday** to be completed by the following **Tuesday**. Children will use Reading Eggspress, which they are familiar with as they used it throughout EYFS and KS1. A comprehension lesson will be set for them to complete that will automatically pop up on screen when they login to their account.
